

'First! Do No Pharm', which is packed with testimonies from leading medical and sector experts from around the world, seeks to expose the unscrupulous behaviour of the pharma industry and medical research fraud perpetuating a cycle of corruption worldwide

British-Indian cardiologist and healthy lifestyle campaigner Aseem Malhotra premiered a new documentary in London's Leicester Square to throw the spotlight on the global pharmaceutical industry's profit-focused approach towards health care.'First! Do No Pharm', which is packed with testimonies from leading medical and sector experts from around the world, seeks to expose the unscrupulous behaviour of the pharma industry and medical research fraud perpetuating a cycle of corruption worldwide.

The premiere on Monday evening was introduced by British-Indian filmmaker Gurinder Chadha, who praised Malhotra for his commitment to his Hippocratic Oath, the ethics pledge historically taken by physicians. 

Singapore's Indian-origin ex-minister pleads guilty in graft case

Singapore's former Transport Minister S Iswaran has pleaded guilty to receiving gifts while in office, local media reported, as proceedings began on Tuesday in a rare graft trial involving a state official in this Asian financial hub. The case has gripped the wealthy city-state which prides itself on having a well-paid and efficient bureaucracy as well as strong governance. Iswaran, who joined the cabinet in 2006, is the first Singaporean minister to be tried in court. The 62-year-old was arrested in July last year and was accused of taking kickbacks worth hundreds of thousands of dollars from property tycoon Ong Beng Seng, partly to advance Ong's business interests. Ong has not been charged with any offence. Iswaran had previously rejected the allegations when he resigned from the cabinet. In court, he had pleaded guilty to the charges of obstructing justice and of a public servant accept-

The last corruption case involving a Singaporean minister was in 1986, when the national development minister was investigated for allegedly accepting bribes. The minister died before he could be charged in court.

According to charge sheets in January, the alleged favours Iswaran received included tickets to English Premier League soccer matches, musicals, a flight on Ong's private plane and tickets to the Singapore Formula 1 Grand Prix.Iswaran was advisor to the Grand Prix's steering committee, while Ong owns the rights to the race. Police investigating anti-Modi graffiti attack on New York temple as hate crime

Police in New York are investigating the take action against "the perpetrators of possible hate crime. A sign board and driveway of the Bochasanwasi Shri Akshar Purushottam Swaminarayan Sanstha (BAPS) temple in Melville, Suffolk County, was defaced with spray paint, the police said. The vandals wrote "anti-Hindu" messages that also targeted Indian prime minister Narendra Modi, the police said. The incident took place between 7pm (local time) on Sunday and 6.30am on Monday, they added. The Suffolk police said its Hate Crimes Unit was investigating the graffiti, which had "threatening and derogatory anti-Hindu messages". The graffiti was painted on the sign board and driveway of the temple, which was inaugurated in 2016. The incident comes just days ahead of Mr Modi's scheduled visit to Long Island on 22 September, where he will address a community event at the Nassau Veterans Memorial Coliseum. BUST OF MAHATMA GANDHI UNVEILED IN SEATTLE AND 2nd OCTOBER DECLARED AS MAHATMA GANDHI DAY

In a unique addition to the city of Seattle landscape, a bust of Mahatma Gandhi was unveiled today at the iconic Seattle Center. just below the base of the Space Needle and adjacent to the Chihuly Garden and Glass Museum. The unveiling marks the first installation of Gandhi's bust in a city known for its vibrant cultural landscape. The unveiling ceremony was attended by notable dignitaries, including Seattle Mayor Bruce Harrell, Congressman Adam Smith, Congresswoman Pramila Jayapal, Lt. Gen. Xavier Brunson, Commander of the US First Corps in Pacific Northwest

and Mr. Eddie Rye, Chair of the Martin Luther King-Gandhi Initiative along with the Consul General of India, Prakash Gupta. It was also attended by eminent members of the Indian American community who offered their respects on the occasion of Gandhi Jayanti.

Israel-Lebanon front: A Prime Minister Modi's recent 3-Day US Visit regional or limited war?

Israeli hostages still held by Hamas, the fractious Israel-Lebanon border is showing signs of becoming a second front, with Lebanese Shia militia Hezbollah and Israeli armed forces exchanging heavy fire. Israel has conducted multiple airstrikes over the past week, with reports claiming the deaths of senior Hezbollah military leaders, including Ibrahim Aqil and Ibrahim Mohammed Qubaisi. Earlier in July, another senior leader, Fuad Shukr, was also killed by a targeted Israeli strike in Beirut.The opening of the Israel-Hezbollah front was neither entirely surprising nor unexpected. Soon after October 7 of last year, when Hamas carried out its horrific terror attack against Israel, the Palestinian group pushed for Hezbollah to target Israel from the north as Gaza became a fierce battleground. Since then, Hamas's capabilities have been significantly depleted. Its political leader, Ismail Haniyeh, was assassinated during a visit to Iran, and its current chief, Yahya Sinwar, is missing in action. Meanwhile, over the past year, civilian casualties have skyrocketed in Gaza and are now also rising in southern Leba-

It is important to remember that none of these fronts are new, and these battles, involving these very actors, have been fought many times over the decades.

AXIS' UNDER STRAIN

Expectations of this conflict spilling over into a regional one remain palpable. The likes of Hamas and Hezbollah, known to enjoy patronage from Iran, would expect Tehran to not only back them but to formally engage Israel's military, potentially drawing the country into a conventional war.

For Iran, both Hamas and Hezbollah are core components of its 'Axis of Resistance', which also includes the Houthis in Yemen, and other smaller groups peppered across Syria and Iraq. The question on many minds is: What is Iran's red line? At what point does it intend to, if at all, engage Israel directly in aid of the so-called axis it backs?

Contrary to such expectations, Iran's new president, Masoud Pezeshkian, has maintained a non-rhetorical stance, replacing expected rhetoric against Israel and the US with dangling a carrot instead: one of willingness to talk with the West, bettering ties, and talking about the nuclear deal once again. This is in contrast to Pezeshkian's swearing-in two months ago, where he took on his new role amidst chants of "Death to America and Israel".

CHALLENGES FOR ARAB WORLD

On the other side of the spectrum, the Arab world watches on nervously as the conflict presents them with multiple challenges. Saudi Arabia, till recently being goaded by the US to normalise rence?

As the war in Gaza continues, with relations with Israel — as done by some other Arab states such as the UAE and Bahrain by way of the Abraham Accords of 2020 — made it clear that it will not do so unless Palestine is recognised as an independent and sovereign state. While this has been a long-standing demand, Riyadh had dangled hope to normalise with Israel to try and sign a comprehensive security arrangement with the US; one as binding as those enjoyed by America's Asian partners, Japan and South Korea.

> Regionally, the likes of Saudi Arabia are trying to maintain two main postures. First, to make sure domestic discontent on the Gaza issue does not spiral. Second, to maintain their trajectories of economic diversification, moving away from oil, and becoming global business hubs. The UAE to a large extent has already achieved this, with its priority now, to manage its core security requirements which quarantees missiles not raining down on Dubai or Abu Dhabi.

> Both these Arab powers are attempting to remain neutral in a conflict they increasingly see as one between Israel and Iran, and have developed working relations with Tehran to this aim. Egypt, which shares a direct border with Gaza, and has a lot of influence within Palestinian movements, is also careful to not make the problem of the Palestinian cause an Egyptian issue, but a Palestinian one. For this, Gaza plays a critical role.

IDEOLOGIES AT ODDS

Beyond the regional aspect, Arab powers, in fact, may not be completely miffed with Israel's plans to de-fang Hamas and Hezbollah. A pertinent question which continues to be raised is what kind of Palestine would it be if a twostate solution is indeed mobilised? While such an outcome remains largely implausible as of today, a Hamas-led or Hamas-like organisation-led outcome would not change the situation much.

The conflict would continue, with an accepted border but contesting ideologies in play. Extreme ideologues, both in Israel and Lebanon, have also come into political power via electoral processes. While in 2022, Hezbollah lost its majority in the Lebanese parliament, it still holds sway over political power in the country. In Israel, far-right parties such as Otzma Yehudit have gained traction, looking to fight ideological challenges with ideology itself.

Finally, a regional war as of today remains unlikely despite the threat perceptions being drawn. The Israel-Lebanon border will be in all likelihood a contained conflict. The biggest question remains what the political off-ramp for the likes of Hezbollah would be, and ultimately, what kind of long-term security Israel would aim towards beyond just setting a precedent of renewed deter-

As Israel strikes Lebanon, can Iran sit it out?

While the situation has been escalating in the Gaza war, all eyes have been on Iran, waiting to see how it responds.

The war in Gaza has taken a anticipation. dramatic turn over the past few weeks. Israel has rapidly revised its war strategy and despite calls for restraints and ceasefire, the conflict is now poised on a dangerous trajectory of escalation and "a point of no return". In the past few days, as a result of Israel's use of unconventional and asymmetric methods, Lebanon has suffered huge losses. Hezbollah, in return, has retaliated and with continuing strikes across both sides, there is little hope of restraint and peace right now. It all started on September 17 and 18 when thousands of communication devices, primarily pagers, exploded mysteriously across multiple locations in Lebanon, killing at least 42 people and injuring more than 3,000. Most initial analyses point to a major intelligence success by Israel — a batch of almost 5,000 pagers ordered by Hezbollah was rigged with undetectable explosives that were activated through remote activation.

On September 23, however, events took a turn for the worse when Israel launched the most massive airstrike in Lebanon to date, killing 492 people and injuring over 1,645. Hezbollah responded and rained over 200 rockets into Israel striking deep, up to the city of Haifa even some West Bank settlements near Tel Aviv. These strikes were part of a carefully planned strategy. There are also strong inputs of Israel firming up plans for a ground invasion into Lebanon and several military formations have been

What happens now?

The last time the two nations locked horns was the 2006 Lebanon war, which involved a massive Israeli air strike and a subsequent ground invasion. Hezbollah paramilitary forces, though severely degraded by the airstrikes, held their ground, leading to a stalemate and ceasefire on August 14, 2006. During the war, Israel lost over 120 soldiers, whereas more than 1,100 died in Lebanon Could the current situation be a repeat of the same? Indications are that Israel has decided to "take the bull by its horns" and end the Hezbollah threat once and for all. Israel's Defense Minister claimed that Israel is decimating all capabilities built by Hezbollah over the past 18 years and that Hassan Nasrallah will be left alone at the top, with his entire leadership structure wiped

Where does Iran stand?

While the situation has been escalating in the Gaza war, all eyes have been on Iran, waiting to see how it responds. Iran had vowed to avenge the assassination of Hamas political chief Ismail Haniyeh on July 30 in Tehran. Iran's supreme leader, Ayatollah Ali Khamenei, was firm and clear about this. However, weeks and months have passed and Iran has yet to retaliate. In its defence. Iran is not known to be quick in its response and often exacts revenge through proxy attacks. Revolutionary Guard Corps who was also benefitted from its growing ties with killed in January 2020 through a US drone strike in Baghdad, or the assassination of Mohsen Fakhrizadeh, a prominent nuclear scientist and often called the father of Iran's covert nuclear weapons program in November 2020, or the killing of Quds Force General Sayved Razi Mousavi in an Israeli airstrike in Damascus, Syria, on December 25, 2023, Iran did not directly retaliate. It was only after Israel targeted its consulate in Damascus on April 1 this year that Iran finally shed its "strategic patience" and undertook a direct strike through a swarm of drones and missiles. It declared any future attack would be met by a swift and equal response — though a response to Haniyeh's assassination is yet to materialise. Reacting to the recent pager attacks on Hezbollah, Iran vowed revenge with IRGC commanderin-chief Hossein Salami stating Israel will face "a crushing response from the axis of resistance". Once again, the Iranian response is awaited.

Can Iran wait any longer?

Iran has been the main support behind Hezbollah, both ideologically and militarily. In Israel's war on Gaza, Iran has emerged as the sole protector of Palestinians, as others in the region, including Egypt and Jordan, watch red line after red line being crossed. Since the signing of the Saudi-Iran peace deal in March 2023, there has been a wave of reconciliation in the region with many countries re-opening embassies and

Russia and an entry into prominent multilateral forums like BRICS and SCO.

Iran realises that Israel has been baiting it to join the war directly since the beginning and except for a brief spat in April this year, it has so far, refrained and exercised caution. The question is: how long will Iran wait? As the rapidly evolving situation in Lebanon indicates, it won't be long before ground action.

If Israel makes major gains in Lebanon, will Iran then keep waiting for the right moment? What will be the right moment if all its proxies and allies bordering Israel have been decimated? How will Iran ensure deterrence against Israel if Israel does not face any direct threat on its borders? What are the chances thereafter that Israel, supported by the US (especially if Donald Trump returns to power), takes the war directly to Iran?If the situation continues to deteriorate in Lebanon, Iran may have no option but to join the battle. But will it be too late by then? Would it have lost the initiative and many Hezbollah lives before it stepped in? This war is set to change the political and security landscape of the region forever. The ongoing elections in the US and the resultant indecision have given Israel a perfect window of a few months to do what it wants to achieve its politicomilitary objectives. If Iran intends to stop it and retain the strategic advantage that it has so far enjoyed across the Levant, it will have to make quick and big

Quad - And India's Role In It - Will Remain Relevant, Thanks To China

The idea of the Quad is now almost D.C., the U.S. announced a new two decades old, emerging for the first time after the tsunami in 2004. Yet, a tone of tentativeness seems to surround this diplomatic partnership, often reflected in experts and media questioning its worth, need, or even existence.

The fourth Quad leaders' summit in Wilmington, Delaware, was no different. Ahead of the summit's start, a reporter asked US President Joe Biden if the Quad would exist beyond November. He quipped, "Much beyond that", and then reiterated the sentiment in his opening statement at the summit. "Challenges will come, the world will change, but the Quad is here to stay." He was backed by Prime Minister Narendra Modi of India, who added that the Quad was here to assist, partner, and complement the efforts of Indo-Pacific countries.

The Impact Of AUKUS

n 2021, just a week before the first in-person Quad summit in Washington,

Nevertheless, the Quad has positioned itself as relevant in another area: reducing China's influence in the global economic space. This year, the Quad Summit announced the Supply Chains Contingency Network to enhance the resilience of semiconductor supply chains. This is a critical area as that China's







Trump calls for death penalty for migrants who kill Americans

Donald Trump portrayed migrants as dangerous criminals during a rally in Aurora, Colorado, on Friday, calling for the death penalty for migrants who kill US citizens as he escalates the antiimmigration rhetoric that has fuelled his presidential run.Flanked by posters of alleged members of the Venezuelan gang Tren de Aragua, Trump also said that if elected he would launch a national "Operation Aurora" to target the gang members.Trump, the Republican presidential candidate, has noticeably hardened his anti-immigration rhetoric in the final weeks of the Nov. 5 election campaign, where he aims to defeat Democratic candidate Kamala Harris. Illegal immigration is a top voter concern, and Trump is seen by most voters as the best person to be able to address it. opinion polls show."I'm hereby calling for the death penalty for any migrant that kills an American citizen or a law enforcement officer," Trump said to loud cheers from a large crowd of supporters. Trump has already proposed an expansion of the death penalty for other offenders, including people convicted of sex trafficking women and children.

Nearly half of U.S. states ban the death penalty. While there is a federal death penalty, it is rarely used, according to the Death Penalty Information Centre, a non-profit group. An expansion of eligible crimes would require an act of the U.S. Congress. One of the hallmarks of Trump's third presidential run has been his focus on what he calls "migrant crime", even though academic studies show immigrants do not commit crimes at a higher rate than native-born Americans. The Harris campaign did not immediately respond to a request for

Afghan man, planning attack on US election day in November, arrested



An Afghan man has been arrested for allegedly plotting to carry out an attack on US election day on behalf of the Islamic State group, the Justice Department said Tuesdav. Nasir Ahmad Tawhedi. 27. was arrested on Monday in the western US state of Oklahoma and has been charged with attempting to provide material support to IS.

"The Justice Department foiled the defendant's plot to acquire semi-automatic weapons and commit a violent attack in the name of (IS) on US soil on Election Day," Attornev General Merrick Garland said in a statement.US voters go to the polls on November 5.The Justice Department said Tawhedi was arrested after he "allegedly took steps to liquidate his family's assets, resettle members of his family overseas, acquire AK-47 assault rifles and ammunition, and commit a terrorist attack in the United States."It

said he conspired to carry out the attack with another Afghan national, a juvenile who was not named but was identified in court documents as his brother-in-law. According to the criminal complaint, Tawhedi entered the United States on September 9, 2021 on a special immigrant visa. It said an FBI "confidential human source" contacted Tawhedi after he recently advertised the sale of his family's personal property on Facebook. The FBI source said he needed a computer for a gun business he was starting and Tawhedi expressed interest in purchasing two AK-47 assault rifles and ammunition, according to the complaint. On Monday, Tawhedi and the juvenile met with "FBI assets" at a rural location in Oklahoma and purchased two AK-47 assault rifles, 10 magazines, and 500 rounds of ammunition, it said. They were immediately arrested.



SAVANNAH, Ga. — Donald Trump on Tuesday pledged to stop U.S. businesses from shipping jobs overseas and to take other countries' jobs and factories by relying heavily on sweeping tariffs to boost auto manufacturing — despite warnings that domestic consumers would pay more and a lack of specifics about how his plans would work.

"I want German car companies to become American car companies. I want them to build their plants here," Trump declared during a speech in Savannah, Georgia. Trump added that, if elected, he'd put a 100% tariff on every car coming into the U.S. from Mexico and that the only way to avoid those charges would be for an automaker to build the cars in the U.S.His ideas, if enacted, could cause a huge upheaval in the American auto industry. Many automakers now build smaller, lower-priced vehicles in Mexico — facilitated by a trade agreement Trump negotiated while president — or in other countries because their profit






