

Navy Rescues 9 Crew Including 8 Indians After Oil Tanker Capsized Off Oman





The entire crew of MT Falcon Prestige, a Comoros-flagged oil tanker capsized 25 nautical miles southeast of Ras Madrakah near the port town of Duqn in Oman. Three Sri Lankan nationals were among the 16 crew members. The operations are being conducted ed challenging weather conditions as the area is experiencing rough seas and strong winds. Navy's Long Range Maritime Reconnaissance aircraft P8I is also assisting in the search for survivors.

The port of Dugm is located on Oman's southwest coast, close to the Sultanate's major oil and gas mining projects, including a major oil refinery that forms part of Duqm's vast industrial zone, Oman's biggest single economic project. The oil tanker was headed for the Yemeni port city of Aden, according to shipping website marinetraffic.com.The capsized oil tanker transmitted a distress call around 10 pm on July 15 off the coast of Oman, sources said. 

Biden held 'tense' call with group of House Democrats over concerns he can't win

(Sai Bureau)-On Saturday, roughly an hour before the assassination attempt on former President Donald Trump -- President Joe Biden was in the midst of a heated phone call with moderate House

The Zoom call, according to multiple sources, did not go well for the president. The call was between the New Democrat Coalition, which includes a mix of nearly 100 moderate and some progressiveadjacent members, and President Biden, and focused mostly on members' concerns about Biden's ability to win the election. One House Democrat on the call told ABC News that Biden was not prepared for questions, that he gave "rambling responses" without answering questions, and downplayed their concerns. Members were largely dismayed with Biden's presentation, lack of a strategy, and preparation for anticipated questions, according to sources.

He was also late to the call by about 30 minutes, per sources. The call turned personal during what was described as a "tense" exchange with Colorado Democrat Rep. Jason Crow, per multiple sources. Crow questioned Biden's mental fitness



The president was "defensive" in his Biden's exchange with the former Army responses, sources say.

A member described to ABC News the exchange was "hard to watch" and detailed how Crow referenced voters' concerns about Biden being "at the helm when they go to sleep at night."

The American republic is crumbling before us - and Democrats must share the blame

There are, of course, clear differences too. The US is a democracy, albeit one severely compromised by wealthy vested interests and concerted rightwing efforts to weaken voting rights, and it is a racially diverse union of states, rather than an unstable federation of nations. But, crucially, if Joe Biden is a Leonid Brezhnev or one of his two short-lived elderly successors, then Donald Trump is no Mikhail Gorbachev: he is more of an American Vladimir Putin. The attempted assassination of Trump marks a further descent into the darkness. Earlier this year, a poll found that more than a third of Americans believe civil war in their lifetime is likely, with another 13% opting for "very likely". In 2021, a leading Canadian political scientist and scholar of violent conflict warned that the weakening of US democratic institutions over decades could lead to the whole system's collapse by 2025, leading to extreme violent instability and a rightwing tyranny prevailing by 2030. A decade ago, such prophecies would have seemed outlandish, deranged even. Now only the foolishly complacent would dismiss them as lying outside the realms of plausibility.

The liberal order is imploding. But just a quarter of a century ago, under Bill Clinton's presidency, many considered it bulletproof. The US was drunk on its recent cold war triumph, and the political and economic order it extolled was described as the final stage of human development by Francis Fukuyama in The End of History? The image of an at-ease, amiable US was projected to the world in cultural exports ranging from Friends to The West Wing, or as humanity's benign protector in Independence Day. Globally, liberal democracies appeared to be becoming the norm, not besieged exceptions. Sure, the arrival of George W Bush, the horror of 9/11 and the killing fields of Iraq were traumatic for progressive Americans, bookended by the most severe crisis of capitalism since the Great Depression. But Barack Obama seemed to wash those sins away. He was the first dictator seizing power in the US, the been accrued by top earners.

assassination of Donald Trump, which injured the former president at a rally for his reelection campaign and killed a spectator, marks a shocking and frightening moment. The Trump shooting is a reminder: we live in a grim new era of political violence

The apparent assassination attempt on Donald Trump, evidently carried out by a lone shooter at a campaign rally in Butler, Pennsylvania, killed one spectator and severely injured several others. The shooter is also dead. The former president himself suffered a minor injury to his right ear, and has been discharged from hospital. While little is known so far about the shooter and his motivations, the incident was a grim reminder of the new era of intensified political violence in which we are living.

There has long been violence in American politics. Democratic congresswoman Gabby Giffords was injured in a mass shooting at a constituent event in Arizona in 2011; President Reagan survived an assassination attempt in 1981, carried out by a stalker of the actor Jodie Foster. Black Americans have faced violent oppression when attempting to exercise the franchise, which for decades was kept a white-only privilege throughout much of the country not only through the cold calculation of law but through the bloody use of force. Trump's own authoritarian politics have been accompanied by bigotry, virulent political tribalism, and a willingness to allow his preferences to be enforced and his enemies punished through physical violence. His rallies, for instance, have been sites of violence since his first campaign for the presidency in 2016, when supporters would frequently attack protesters and members of the media.

Trump supporters have long taken it upon themselves to enact vigilante political violence against his enemies. In 2018, a Floridabased Trump supporter, Cesar Sayoc, conducted a terror campaign in which he mailed bombs to critics of President Trump, including Barack Obama, Hillary Clinton, John Brennan, Robert De Niro, Alexandria Ocasio-Cortez, and Joe Biden. And in 2022, a deranged Trump supporter, David DePape, broke into then House speaker Nancy Pelosi's San Francisco home and beat her husband, Paul Pelosi, in the head with a hammer.

Unfortunately, gun violence – against Trump or anyone else – is all too American

"Political violence is unacceptable and has no place in this country," said Arizona's governor, Katie Hobbs, and "political violence has absolutely no place in this country", insisted California congresswoman Barbara Lee, while President Joe Biden stated, "There's no place for this kind of violence in America"

"As one whose family has been the victim of political violence, I know firsthand that political violence of any kind has no place in our society," affirmed Nancy Pelosi, referencing the attacker who broke into her home in 2022 to kidnap her and, in her absence, seriously injured her husband. "There is no place for political violence in this country, period," said Governor Gretchen Whitmer, who was the target of a kidnapping plot by far-right militiamen in 2020 who intended to make her the centerpiece of a show trial.

Dozens of others reached for versions of this "no place in America" declaration, and I wondered if "no place" meant something like when Jesus was born in a stable because, according to the Gospel of Luke, "there was no place for them in the inn." That is, the United States is full to overflowing of violence of many kinds and afflicted with many enthusiasts for violence and the weapons with



which it is most often fatally inflicted. All this came in the wake of an event in Pennsylvania in which the ear of an elderly man was grazed by a bullet fired by a young man with a semi-automatic weapon. One bystander died of a bullet to the head and two others were seriously injured. Later that night four people were killed in a nightclub in Birmingham, Alabama, and nine others wounded by another gunman. Four more people were killed in a home in Holly Springs, Mississippi, in yet another shooting Sunday, and three people were shot in

Charleston, South Carolina, nonfatally. None of them were running for president, so these other stories weren't major news.

You could drop in dozens of local news stories of shootings like that any weekend in this country over the past decade years, if it wasn't the kind of week in which the carnage was so immense it became a major news story, as when an 18-year-old gunman murdered 19 elementary-school children and two teachers in Uvalde,


Texas, in May of 2022, while heavily armed police stood by. Every day, on average, 327 Americans are shot and 117 die of the injuries, according to one gun-control-advocacy site.

On Wednesday a white policeman shot and killed a Black shoplifter reportedly suffering from mental health issues in Charlotte, North Carolina. The United States is drenched in violence, riddled with violence, rotten with violence. There is room for violence in this country founded on slavery and the genocide and dispossession of Native Americans. There has always been epidemic violence against women in this country. But a lot of recent violence has been cultivated as an asset for rightwing politicians and a cash crop for gun manufacturers.

The day the Black shoplifter died, I spoke at a campaign launch for a first time San Francisco candidate. So did the activist Cleve Jones, who talked about Harvey Milk. In the late 1970s Jones was a young intern for and friend of Milk, the out gay politician whose election to San Francisco's board of supervisors was a watershed moment in queer history.

Did Donald Trump just win the election?

You've almost certainly seen the pictures by now. You've probably seen them a hundred times. A fist in the air, blood dripping from his ear, an American flag above him, a defiant expression on his face. Trump quickly jumping up from an assassination attempt at a Pennsylvania rally and appearing to mouth the words: "Fight! Fight!" If you fed "all-American tough guy president" into an Al image generator, it wouldn't spit out anything half as powerful. Obviously, there's nothing remotely positive about a terrible act of political violence that left an innocent bystander and the shooter dead. But in terms of optics for Trump's presidential campaign? Well, as Trump himself told the New York Post on Sunday: "A lot of people say it's the most iconic photo they've ever seen." He added: "They're right and I didn't die. Usually you have to die to have an iconic picture."

There's still a lot we don't know about what happened on Saturday. We know who the suspected shooter is - the FBI has identified him as 20-year-old Thomas Matthew Crooks – but we don't know why he did it. Crooks was a registered Republican but records show that when he was 17 he made a \$15 donation to ActBlue, a political action committee that raises money for Democratic politicians. With the information we have right now, it's hard to paint Crook as an extreme

Republican Donald Trump has secured over his return to power for a second term. The New 270 electoral votes, defeating Kamala Harris in the 2024 US presidential election. Universities in Bangladesh shut their doors and authorities raid opposition HQ after deadly protests

DHAKA, Bangladesh (AP) — Several major universities in Bangladesh agreed to shut their doors Wednesday after at least six people died in violent campus protests over the allocation of government jobs, police raided the main opposition party's headquarters, and student protesters announced a total shutdown of all but essential services. After two days of clashes, the University Grants Commission urged all public and private universities to close until further notice, and about a dozen major public universities said they would, according to officials and media reports. Wednesday was a public holiday in Bangladesh, so the actual number of universities that closed was expected to become clearer on Thursday. Among them was Dhaka violence. What's behind Bangladesh's violent student protests that have led to shut down of universities?

Universities across Bangladesh erupted in protests. The demonstrations have turned violent - at least five people have died and hundreds of others have been injured, as students raise their voices against job quota.

The government has cancelled classes in public and private campuses across the country. It has also decided to close medical, textile, engineering and other colleges affiliated with the universities until further notice, according to bdnews24, Bangladesh's leading news publisher. We take a look at the reason behind the protests and how the situation has escalated

Bangladesh?

The protests in Bangladesh started on 1 July, days after a decision by the Bangladesh High Court to reinstate a 30 per cent government job quota for descendants of those who fought in the Nahid Islam, the coordinator of the anticountry's 1971 war of independence.
