

Anmol Bishnoi, Lawrence Bishnoi's brother wanted in Baba Siddique case, to be deported to India

(By Our Staff Reporter) NEW DELHI: Anmol Bishnoi, the younger brother of jailed gangster Lawrence Bishnoi and one of India's most-wanted organised crime fugitives, has been removed from the United States and is being brought to India, people familiar with the matter said.

Anmol is expected to land in New Delhi on Wednesday, a person aware of the matter said. hours after the US Department of Homeland Security (DHS) informed the family of Baba Siddique, a former Maharashtra minister, who was shot dead in Bandra on October 12, 2024, that Anmol had been removed from American soil.

"This email is to inform you that ANMOL BISHNOI has been removed from the United States... The offender was removed on November 18, 2025," the email said. Siddique's family released a screenshot of the email.

The National Investigation Agency (NIA) counts Anmol Bishnoi among India's 'most wanted' and had announced a reward of ?10 lakh for information leading to his arrest.

Officials said Anmol faces at least 18 criminal cases in India, Australian authorities said, as including the conspiracy to murder former Maharashtra victim. Siddique, who was shot dead outside his son Zeeshan's office building in Bandra East on October 12. He was shot by sustained three bullet injuries.



Probe Agency Attaches Rs 51.70 Dubai-**Based Assets In SBI Fraud Case**

(News Agencies)- The Enforcement Directorate (ED) has attached nine luxurious foreign immovable properties located in Dubai (UAE) in the Rs 1266.63 crore State Bank of India (SBI) fraud case allegedly done by Advantage Overseas Private Limited (AOPL), the agency said on Tuesday. The attached properties are in the form of apartments and commercial spaces, worth Rs 51.70 crore. These properties were attached on November 17. The 'Ten-Year Itch' in **India-US Defence Relations**

month for the US-India 'Major Defence Partnership', signalling, as many in the media put it, "stable ties in the India-US defence sector". To watchers in the Indian strategic circuit, however, it is 'yawn-time' once again. Human memory may be short, but it is not so imbecile as to inhibit differentiation between historical experience and political hyperbole. In matters of national interests, no country is indispensable. This is especially true if one side of the pact is a superpower and the other has an acutely adverse power gradient. The India-US defence relationship can be analysed through four historical periods.

Friendship





(News Agencies) Sajeeb Wazed Joy, son of former Bangladesh Prime Minister Sheikh Hasina, condemned the death sentence handed down to his mother as a political vendetta rather than a legitimate judicial process. In an exclusive interview with India Today TV, Wazed described the International Crimes Tribunal's conviction of Hasina for "crimes against humanity" — relating to alleged incitement. ordering lethal force, and failing to prevent mass killings during the 2024 student uprising — as a

"complete mockery of justice." He argued that the trial was deeply flawed, "Everyone knew this sentence was predetermined. The trials were rushed... finished within 100-140 days," he said. "The unelected, unconstitutional and undemocratic government amended the laws, which can't be done without parliament." Wazed also claimed that Hasina was not allowed to choose her


own defence lawyers; instead, the court effectively imposed one for her: "She was not permitted her own defence attornevs...it's a complete mockery of justice." He added, "Right now, there is no rule of law in Bangladesh. Any legal appeal will have to wait until the rule of law is restored, at which point, the verdict will be overturned.'

Wazed went on to argue that the sentencing is not about justice but revenge. He said the Muhammad Yunus-led interim regime, which he called "unelected" and "illegal", has shielded its own side from accountability. "They have actually passed a law which provides immunity for the killings of all the police officers and all our party activists," he said. He charged that hundreds of Awami League activists were detained, while many policemen were killed during the unrest —

> yet only Hasina's side is being prosecuted. "How can you have justice only for one side but no justice for the other side at all? That is not justice," he said.



Hasina, 78, was convicted in absentia by Bangladesh's special International Crimes Tribunal. She was found guilty on multiple counts, including

giving incitement to violence and ordering the use of lethal weapons, drones and helicopters. In her first reaction. Hasina, speaking from exile in New Delhi. called the verdict "biased, politically motivated delivered by a rigged tribunal" under an "unelected government with no democratic mandate." Meanwhile, Wazed warned that under the present "illegal regime," there is no genuine rule of law: "The courts are just rubber-stamping everything."

The 'Ten-Year Itch' in **India-US Defence Relations**

This writer was doing his staff course in the US in 1992 and mentioned this in a paper as proof of an improvement in our defence relationship. "Who is Kicklighter?" asked the American officers (Admiral Kicklighter was the Commander of US Pacific Command)! The fact that India did not figure in the security and 'friendship' environment of US policymakers was driven home. Later events have only confirmed

Remember The Not-So-Great '90s?

India's friend, the Soviet Union, collapsed in the 1990s. But what stands out for New Delhi in that decade is the American-led wide-ranging, multi-sectorial sanctions following India's nuclear tests in 1998. The beginning of the 21st century started a thaw, with both countries calling each other 'natural allies' due to their democratic traditions. Many deals for transport aircraft and helicopters for the Indian Air Force (IAF), artillery guns for the Army and naval equipment were signed - and US defence companies made handsome monies through these contracts. The standout deal was the 2008 India-US nuclear agreement, but a simple question begs an answer: for all the brouhaha of those years, what extraordinary event has actually matured on ground from the nuclear deal that was termed 'pathbreaking?'

And then came the 'India-US Defence Technology and Trade Initiative' (DTTI) of 2012, trumpeted as something that would cut bureaucracy and enhance cooperation in niche areas. Pushed by the US Under Secretary of Defence Ashton Carter, it was to enhance cooperation by overcoming impediments created by the bureaucratic structures of the two countries. To do that, the nodal officers were highranking officials: the Secretary of Defence Production from India and the Under Secretary for Defence Acquisition for the US side. The giveaways, however, were the listed four

'pathfinder' technologies - chemical and biological warfare clothing, mobile hybrid power systems, hand-held UAVs and roll-on roll-off ISR modules for C-130J aircraft. These, in layman's terms, were chicken-feed compared to the promised cutting-edge technology.

Don't Fall For It

Later, seven working groups were formed under the Defence Technology and Trade Initiative (DTTI) - once again with media fanfare - but all have only resulted in numerous seminars, meetings and international travel for officials. In between, India was declared a Major Defence Partner in 2016, and in August 2018 was accorded Strategic Trade Authority Tier 1 (STA-1) status that, on paper, allowed US manufacturers to sell dual-use technology to New Delhi. The iCET (Initiative on Critical and Emerging Technologies) followed in 2022; the fact remains that the US (or for that matter, any country) would not part with critical technologies. despite all these acronym-rich pacts and treaties being signed.

And now comes the 'Major Defence Partnership' agreement signed by Defence Minister Rajnath Singh and Pete Hegseth, US Secretary of War. But this was followed immediately with US-China rapprochement through the Trump-Xi Jinping meeting in South Korea on October 30. Only people with a blinkered sense of history would not see the negative import for India of the US disaffirming China as being its "most consequential strategic competitor", as enunciated in its 2022 National Defense Strategy document. Pete Hegseth, after the Trump-XI Jinping meeting, tweeted thatpeace, stability, and good relations are the best path for our two great and strong countries. As President Trump said, his historic "G2 meeting" set the tone for everlasting peace and success for the U.S. and China.'

Trump and Mamdani form an unlikely alliance at White House meeting

Donald Trump and Zohran Mamdani, the New York City mayor-elect, walked out of their meeting on Friday afternoon with an unlikely alliance, agreeing to work together on housing, food prices and costof-living concerns that have defined both their political appeals to working-class voters. "We agreed a lot more than I would have thought," Trump said in the Oval Office, sometimes jumping in to shield Mamdani from aggressive questioning from the press.

The sit-down - which many had anticipated would be contentious, given months of intense rhetoric in which Trump branded Mamdani a "communist lunatic" - instead produced camaraderie, warm words and concrete pledges of cooperation between the Republican president and the self-described democratic socialist who secured a commanding electoral victory earlier at the beginning of November with over 50% of the vote. "I feel very confident that he can do a very good job," Trump said after the meeting, offering praise for his ideological opposite. "The better he



How social media is fuelling the rise of travel dysmorphia

Travelling has become the aspiration body has flaws or is defective compared to as a reminder of how "behind in life" they think expect marriage to do, and what everyone is holding dear. While this term is not a medical condition yet, it works on a similar emotional blueprint: inadequacy, self-criticism, anxiety about not measuring up, and bit of existential crisis too. And then, there's social media, of course!

Travel isn't just a hobby any more; it's a trend to keep up with. they are. What might sound vain and ridiculous, travel dysmorphia is only getting real with time and new social media forms of expression — and experts totally agree. Speaking with India Today earlier, Dr Nandita Kalra, supervising counselling psychologist at Rocket Health, explains that social media affects one's self-worth, identity and validation. "Many people now measure selfworth through visibility. 'If I'm not part of what's trending, do I still matter?' This mindset disconnects people from their authentic preferences. Instead of asking, 'Do I like this?' they ask, 'Will this be liked?' That constant chase for the next thing creates emotional emptiness."

The idea of travel has always been about taking a break, rejuvenating, discovering yourself, or maybe just coping with grief. So, the moment the idea of chasing sunsets, being "beach bums," or dreaming of waking up in clouds becomes performative more than a private feeling of euphoria, the idea of travel becomes counteractive. I was embroiled in the fake news controversy, which had swiftly created a tsunami across social media. So many of us-seasoned mediawallas-jumped the gun and posted heartfelt condolences for a beloved actor who was ailing. But alive. Incredible how rapidly the rumour of his death spread, and more importantly, how many responsible people believed it from Minister of Defence Rajnath Singh to Uttar Pradesh Chief Minister Yogi Adityanath, misled by their tagda intelligence reports. Who are we in comparison? Tributes started pouring in. This isn't the first time fake news about a celebrity's death dominated headlines. Lata Mangeshkar was killed off several times during the past few years, till she finally died in 2022, aged 92. Such was the devotion and love for Mangeshkar, we wanted her to live forever. 





Bhajan Clubbing goes big, and it's selling out like a concert

Picture this: a group of young friends at an event, banging heads, hands in the air, dancing to the rhythmic beats and singing their hearts out together. Sounds like any other live band gig or EDM night, right? Only, it's not. This is bhajan clubbing - a growing trend among Indian Gen Z where devotional music replaces bass drops, the only high is collective chanting, and steaming cups of chai, and not booze, fuel the night.

India has always been big on devotion, spiritual community gatherings and that whole coming-together energy. But what's popping up now is a fresher, looser take on spirituality. It's less about rigid rituals and more about personal connection, a moment to breathe, and a space to shake off everyday stress.

After fake shaadis, bhajan clubbing is the new subculture taking off with the youth. Unlike traditional jagrans or kirtans, these bhajan-jamming sessions are far more relaxed.

Kolkata-based Prachi and Raghav, the sibling jamming duo known as Backstage Siblings, even created a separate social media handle dedicated entirely to bhajan jams and satsangs after their devotional performances went viral, kickstarting the buzz around the trend. Sumiran Satsang is where they sell tickets for their upcoming bhajan shows.

What's drawing youth to spirituality

"What you're seeing is not a fad it's a cultural correction. For decades, spirituality was packaged as something that belonged to elders. But India's youth have always been spiritually curious, they just lacked formats that spoke their language. Bhajan clubbing brings devotion into spaces where young people already exist: music, community, rhythm, energy," says Prithviraaj Shetty, devotional. The crowd isn't just the tools like astrology and tarot as a young entrepreneur in faith-tech and founder of Bhagvad Gita For AllBut what's drawing them toward spirituality? Many experts point to elevated stress levels and increasing mental health challenges as key factors influencing

"Gen Z is the most anxious yet selfaware generation. They grew up with instability, a pandemic, economic uncertainty, intense competition, and constant online comparison. Spirituality offers the very things their environment lacks: certainty, inner grounding, and meaning. Unlike earlier generations that followed spirituality as tradition. Gen Z follows it as self-care," says Dr Chandni

"They're not seeking rituals; they're seeking regulation. They want practices that soothe the nervous system, reduce overwhelm, and give them tools to cope with emotional chaos." Dr Tugnait adds. And bhajan clubbing is their way to make spirituality flexible, accessible, and compatible with their lifestyle.

"Gen Z, influencers, and content creators - people consuming and sharing in real time - are helping spread good things widely. Events like Radhika Das's kirtan concerts, where 8,000 people showed up in Delhi at Yashobhoomi Convention Centre (November 16), show how devotional gatherings have become huge. Everyone was singing, dancing, and celebrating devotion together. Social media deserves a lot of credit for this," says Giresh Vasudev Kulkarni, founder of Temple Connect and temple management company International Temples Convention and EXPO.

Nirvaan Birla, a singer who also performs devotional concerts as part of his Sound For The Soul initiative, agrees that Gen Z has really taken ownership of this movement. "They're showing up in huge numbers -not just to listen, but to participate: to sing, to chant, to immerse themselves." Birla tells India

So next time, it might not be a Coldplay concert triggering a sold-out rant on social media, but a bhajanclubbing night. Just don't be surprised.

INDIA has a Congress-sized hole. And the fix begins with a little humility

Without a Congress revival, there can be no challenge to the BJP pan-nationally. Modi's party is growing, and almost entirely at the cost of the Congress.

After the Lok Sabha stumble 18 months ago, the spectacular wins in Haryana, Maharashtra, Delhi and now Bihar, Narendra Modi's followers can believe his invincibility is back. And India's politics is back to being a onehorse race.

His opponents, at the same time, will think about what they are doing wrong, why doesn't anti-incumbency hurt him or his partners, and how did INDIA bloc lose the momentum of the summer of 2024. They could begin by asking themselves some hard questions. More specifically, they have to ask Congress party. The devastating post-Lok Sabha slide of the Opposition is mostly owed to the Congress.

Without a Congress revival there can be no challenge to the BJP. In West Bengal and Tamil Nadu Mamata Baneriee and M.K. Stalin can still keep him at bay. Kerala has its own peculiar politics, but the BJP is growing and almost entirely at the cost of the Congress. In states where Congress piggybacks on a votebank rich regional party, it's a liability. Check out Uttar Pradesh with Akhilesh Yadav's SP in 2017, Bihar with RJD in 2020 and

Everywhere else, a direct BJP-Congress fight is a noncontest after its heady flicker of 2024. And yet, the Congress retains just over 20 percent votes nationally. Whether 44 seats in 2014 or 99 (with alliances) in 2024, it has remained intact. One in five Indians simply vote for the Congress symbol. Let's see it this way. In 2024 the Congress polled 21.4 percent of the vote. That is more than the aggregate vote share of the next eight reboot as a Modi-era startup with parties, from NDA and INDIA alliances.



India's agricultural paradox—rising output, rising imports, and a shrinking trade surplus

Acurious shift has been occurring the availability of staple goods, yet it is nation celebrating unprecedented foodgrain harvests and increased horticultural production, the latest official figures from the Directorate General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics power subsidies and low-cost fertilisers indicate that agricultural and allied imports have increased over two consecutive years, rising from \$52.67 billion in 2022-23 to \$62.52 billion in 2024-

In contrast, exports have remained relatively stagnant. As a result, there is a diminishing net surplus in a sector where India should be strengthening its global competitive advantage. The concern is not that India is increasingly reliant on imports across all sectors some strategic imports will invariably be economically justified — but rather that the trade deficit is tightening specifically in commodities where domestic production capacity exists but remains underutilised

This discrepancy between potential and actual performance encapsulates the core of India's agricultural paradox, with the data presenting a compelling narrative. The chart illustrates that while exports have remained robust, they have exhibited fluctuations: approximately patterns have not followed suit. \$52.67 billion in 2022-23, decreasing to \$48.30 billion in 2023-24, before rebounding to \$51.87 billion in 2024-25. In contrast, the trend in imports tells a different story. They experienced a slight decline from \$33.79 billion to \$31.97 billion in 2023-24, followed by a significant increase to \$36.96 billion in 2024-25. Consequently, the agricultural net surplus has contracted from about \$18.88 billion in 2022-23 to \$16.33 billion in 2023-24, and further to \$14.91 billion in 2024-25. In short, although exports showed recovery in the last year, the more rapid and consistent rise in imports has progressively diminished the surplus.

What matters is the direction of the trend: imports are increasing at a more rapid pace than exports, even in sectors where India has traditionally enjoyed a natural competitive strength. Subsidy hunting and the cropping trap To understand the rationale behind why India imports what it is capable of producing domestically, it is essential to examine policy design rather than merely agricultural practices.

For several decades, agricultural policy has prioritised price stabilisation and the protection of political constituencies over fostering long-term competitiveness. This has resulted in a system that incentivises the pursuit of subsidies rather than productivity system that is highly effective in ensuring sectors that currently influence both domestic consumption patterns and trade balances.

Minimum Support Prices (MSPs) provide farmers with incentives to focus on a limited range of crops that the state promises to procure. While this clustering is a rational choice for farmers, it incurs a national cost: the underdevelopment of sectors where demand has outpaced supply. Although urban consumption patterns have diversified, cropping

When processors and retailers cannot rely on consistent domestic quality or timely availability, they turn to imports. The import data from the Directorate General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics (DGCI&S) vividly illustrate this trend, with rising import values for edible vegetables, fruits and nuts, cocoa preparations, milling products and processed foods. This phenomenon does not stem from an inability of Indian farmers to produce these goods. Rather, the economic incentives associated with subsidybacked crops are significantly stronger than those offered by the free-market economics of diversification.

The political certainty of MSP procurement outweighs the uncertain profits associated with competing in highvalue horticulture or food-processing supply chains. Furthermore, this policy framework is intricately linked with statelevel electoral cycles, resulting in slow change. Governments prioritise price stability to mitigate the political risk of food inflation, perpetuating the existing cycle. Imports as a policy safety valve In response to sharp price increases, governments frequently mitigate import restrictions or reduce tariffs in order to expedite the entry of essential goods into the market. These interventions offer short-term consumer stability and help enhancement. This has resulted in a smooth volatility. However, they come with a trade-off.

This does not imply that India is incapable of manufacturing these items; it indicates that the existing framework makes it easier to import them than to establish robust domestic supply chains. This pattern is evident in the data. Edible oil imports remain structurally high despite India's suitability for oilseed cultivation. Imports of cocoa preparations have increased as demand surpasses domestic capacity. Dairy imports tend to rise in years when domestic production tightens. India's reliance on fertiliser imports exemplifies a broader trend.

According to the Department of Fertilisers, approximately one-third of India's urea requirements and a significant portion of phosphatic and potassic fertilisers are imported, despite the existence of domestic production capacity in several sectors. This dependency increases when global prices decrease or when domestic gas supplies become constrained. The convenience of importing, coupled with heavily subsidised retail prices, often results in long-term investment in domestic production and nutrient balance being deprioritised. As the demand for crop diversification grows, ensuring more resilient fertiliser supply chains will be crucial for strengthening India's overall agricultural competitiveness. These are not isolated occurrences but reflect a choices made now.

When imports readily address broader structural challenge: the system than enhance competitiveness. A forwardlooking strategy would aim to retain the stabilising benefits of trade while also bolstering incentives for domestic investment, diversification and value addition. The objective is not to restrict imports but to ensure that India's inherent agricultural strengths translate into a broader, more resilient export surplus.

> The cost of an underperforming trade surplus The diminishing agricultural trade surplus is a tangible concern, impacting the resilience of India's balance of payments. Historically, agriculture has served as a reliable buffer against fluctuation in services or manufactured exports. As services exports increase and manufactured exports fluctuate, agriculture was expected to provide stability. However, it is currently losing its footing. Countries that dominate global food markets, such as Brazil, Argentina and Thailand, utilise their agricultural surpluses macroeconomic stabilisers. Despite its natural resources, India is relinquishing this advantage.

> The rising imports of products that India has the potential to produce domestically result in higher foreign exchange outflows and increased vulnerability to global commodity price fluctuations. The opportunity cost is immense. If India had aligned its production potential with competitive supply chains, its agricultural trade surplus could have been two or three times its current level.

> Such a surplus could have offset energy import expenses or alleviated currency pressures. Instead, India is increasingly importing goods that its farmers could profitably cultivate. The issue stems from a policy design problem rather than productivity. Fortunately, the path forward is clear. Addressing subsidy distortions. enhancing quality infrastructure, promoting storage and cold-chain investment, establishing predictable tariff regimes, and shifting procurement incentives towards diversification can restore balance to the system. The budgetary emphasis on oilseeds mission programs, and horticulture clusters is a step in the right direction, but sustained commitment is essential. India's farmers require enhanced competitiveness rather than increased protection. As illustrated in the chart, the country stands at a critical juncture. Agricultural imports are rising, exports have stagnated, and the surplus is diminishing. However, this trend is not destiny; it is a consequence of past decisions and can be reversed by the

The US State Department's December 2025 Visa Bulletin delivers a rare month of forward movement for Indian employment-based green card applicants, even as family-based categories remain locked in place. The bulletin's cutoff dates determine which applications the US government will now process. Anyone whose priority date, the day their petition was first filed, is earlier than the published cutoff moves ahead. Anyone with a later date remains stuck in the queue.




